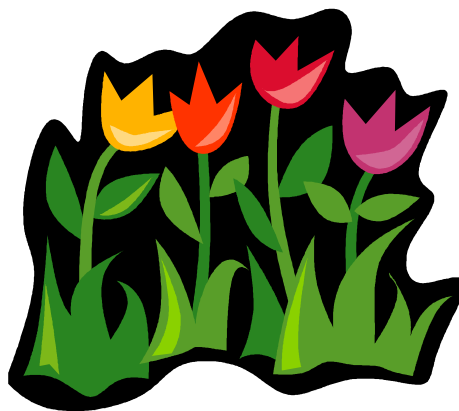


Passenger Transportation Board Weekly Bulletin

2014 PDV Fleet Size Review Outcomes

PDV fleet size reviews are conducted under section 31(4) of the Passenger Transportation Act. They are limited to licensees with passenger directed vehicles (“PDVs”) that have been operating below the maximum allowable fleet size for at least 2 consecutive years. When a review is concluded, the maximum fleet size may remain unchanged, or the Board may reduce the maximum fleet size to reflect actual or planned levels of operation.
